

Liz's Story

San Antonio's SARAH (Sewing and Reaching A Heart) Chapter led by Liz Page celebrated eleven years as a Threads of Love chapter by dedicating "Sarah's Workshop", a 5004 square foot modular building, to God's glory on September 12, 2010.

After eight years of praying and planning, SARAH volunteers can meet in pleasant and spacious air conditioned quarters. This building consists of a very large sewing room accommodating 30 sewing machines and sergers, as well as two embroidery machines. In addition, there are three large cutting tables and individual stations for processing angels; loaves; grievance items; journals; sorting; packing; patterns; and a distribution center. A second large room is used as a combination meeting, fellowship, and dining facility that can seat 50 comfortably. The third large room is used for storage, contribution intake, and as a mail center. This latter area combines three large storage units previously rented off campus. Finally, there is a small office used for administration and private consultations, when warranted.

Sarah's Workshop is beautifully and tastefully decorated on the inside by a talented friend who donated her time and expertise. Gorgeous stained glass windows, five in all, frame the front of the building and a special rest area in the fellowship room honors the memory of Brenda Sheehan who served faithfully until cancer took her life two years ago.

Corporate donors graced us with a functional irrigation system as well as beautiful landscaping. Building specifications meet all Federal, State and City handicap requirements.
